**Team Lead/Case Manager: Youth Wellbeing Team
(Full-time, 1 Year Term – Position based in Sioux Lookout)**

Position Summary

The Team Lead/Case Manager (TL/CM) works collaboratively with all team members of the Payahtakenemowin Wellness Program to ensure the safety and well-being of youth from Shibogama communities who are away from their communities, attending school in Sioux Lookout and at Pelican Falls First Nation High School and/or receiving specialized treatment/interventions. The TL/CM also works closely with school personnel, boarding home guardians, community service workers and other professionals who are involved in the treatment and care of youth.

The TL/CM also provides consultation/education services to families, caregivers, community professionals, and the broader community on the wholistic model of healing and wellness.

Required Qualifications and Experience Related to the Position Include:

- Minimum Bachelor degree from an accredited university in Social Work, Psychology or other Social Science field relevant to the position. A combination of education, training and experience may also be considered.
- Minimum two years' recent related experience in a mental health and substance use environment, or an equivalent combination of education, training and experience.
- Specialized training in case management skills in relation to mental health and addictions.
- Training related to trauma-informed practices appropriate to Indigenous communities
- Sound knowledge of the Mental Health Act and Child and Family Services Act.
- Membership or membership qualification in a recognized provincial regulatory body.
- Thorough understanding and application of integration of both traditional Indigenous approaches and mainstream approaches, with a general competency in treating concurrent disorders in youth.
- Thorough understanding of Indigenous approaches to healing and wellness approaches.
- Excellent communication skills: oral, written and interpersonal. Fluency in Oji-Cree is preferred.
- Successful candidate must provide a clean, current CPIC and VSS prior to hiring.
- Must possess a valid driver's license and provide a current driving abstract.
